| <p>In view of the National Education Policy-2020 (NEP-2020) of the Government of India and subsequent guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission (UGC) for Curriculum & Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP), the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal has implemented CCFUP in the State Universities from the session 2023-24 on 17 March, 2023. Belda College, in concurrence with Vidyasagar</p> | |

University, follows the new Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes in Semester mode for various disciplines. To cater to the needs of students with diverse talents, aspirations and professional requirements, necessary qualitative changes in its undergraduate programmes have been implemented. Taking care of the needs of the generation, the CCFUP, in light of NEP-2020, has recommended Multi-disciplinary Undergraduate Programme with multiple exit and entry options with Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree at each stage of the exit. The new Curriculum has emphasized on continuous learning and evaluation, holistic education by allowing students to experience inter/multidisciplinary and Value Added courses through a 3- Year or 4-Year Undergraduate programmes with flexible degree having multiple entry and exit options. The students are provided ample opportunities during the programme of study to accumulate credits by opting Major Courses, Minor Courses, Multidisciplinary Courses, Ability Enhancement Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses and Value Added Courses under various disciplines. This system aims to strengthen the academic potential of the student as it provides flexibility in the choice of courses offered beyond the framework of the respective disciplines of study. Consequently, Belda College has already undertaken initiatives to transmute itself into a holistic and multidisciplinary institution of learning as envisioned by the propositions of NEP 2020. The focus is hence extended to imparting knowledge in "scientific," "vocational," and "professional" fields, as well as "soft skills" alongside the specific subject area. The prescribed syllabi require students of all undergraduate programmes to study Environmental Science. Again, all undergraduate students studying in Honours and General courses including those studying Technology (BCA) are required to undertake Modern Indian Languages (Compulsory Bengali and Compulsory English in alternative semesters) as an integral part of the curricula. The fusion of Humanities and Social Sciences with Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) in undergraduate levels gives a wider exposure to the students and help them broaden their understanding. Our college has infused a credit-based system for the courses it offers and includes project work in the areas of environmental education. The college organizes and encourages the students to partake in value-based education and activities in the areas of community engagement and service at regular intervals. The current curricula prescribed by the Affiliating University provide ample scope for flexible innovations, and community engagements. Alongside the compulsory research work in Environmental Studies, students are encouraged to adopt multidisciplinary approach to discover positive and

practical solutions to emergent ecological issues. NEP 2020 provides scope to students to choose multi-disciplinary courses as minor courses in tune with their major courses.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Belda College, following the issuance of the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal of implementation of CCFUP in the State Universities from the session 2023-24, has adopted NEP 2020. This new educational framework accommodates flexibility of learning through multiple entries and exits, enabling students to opt in or out of the courses according to their choices. Academic Bank of Credit, as a vital component in executing this flexible model, functions as a digital repository of the academic credits earned by the students in various courses that they have taken in different HEIs throughout their academic journey. ABC serves as an authentic central record for checking and citing the credit point of any student at any given point in time. The adoption of this system allows the students to carry forward their academic credits from one semester to the next in terms of intra-university domain. The flexible model of multiple entries and exits has been made available to the students of the Institution from the session 2023-2024. Staff members of the Institution have been duly sensitized in this regard. They are also encouraged to introduce innovative pedagogical approaches in the teaching-learning process. As per NEP guidelines, full library access to journals, a fully functional computer lab, and laboratory infrastructure for research work are the college's top priorities. Faculties are encouraged to make use of digital platforms such as SWAYAM, MOOC, NSQF for smooth transition to future programs, as advised in NEP 2020. The practice of sensitisation of teaching community as well as the anticipated student community of the locality for linking Aadhar cards with their Mobile Numbers required in the registration process of the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) has been started in the previous session and the same is being continued in the present time as well.

17.Skill development:

Belda College is committed to fostering a holistic educational experience for its learners. Through a multifaceted approach, the institution aims to instil positive values and equip students with essential life skills. Institution's initiatives include: Observance of Significant Days: The Institution commemorate important occasions with fervour to raise awareness and promote values. Programs and Seminars: The departments organize events

that facilitate knowledge exchange, critical thinking and personal growth. Integration of Education and Skill Development through Add-On and Certificate Courses: By aligning education with practical skills, the Institution aims to equip students with the competencies required to face the present world and demands of job market. Some Add-on or Certificate Courses like- Certificate Course in Sanskrit Vyakaran, Certificate Course on Creative Writing, Certificate Course on Logical Reasoning by Mathematics, Gender, Media and Advertisement etc. VU Prescribed Curriculum: B. VOC courses in Medical and Laboratory Technology, Health Care have been introduced in the academic session 2021-22 and is being continued successfully with increasing demand and students' enrolment. The curriculum prescribed by the Affiliating University provides provision for skill enhancement through the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC's), Value Added Courses (VAC's) which aim to enhance skills of the students in cognitive, analytical, employable, communication, social and other domains. Additionally, Industrial visits & Field Visits as per the prescribed curriculum, the departments of the college organise field visits & Industrial visits for their students to provide them with a first-hand experience of research and data collection. Institution's Innovative Council (IIC): The college has established the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) which intends to motivate students through webinars, guidance & trainings to develop their competencies, preparing them for the job market.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The integration of Indian knowledge systems (IKS) into college education, particularly through the medium of Indian languages and culture, represents a significant step towards reclaiming and revitalizing indigenous wisdom. Belda College, with its commitment to bilingual education and celebration of diverse cultural traditions, stands as a prime example of this progressive approach. By incorporating elements of IKS into its teaching-learning methodology, the college not only promotes regional languages but also fosters a deeper understanding and appreciation of India's rich heritage. The bilingual mode of instruction at Belda College, where courses are taught in both Bengali and English, reflects a conscious effort to cater to students' linguistic diversity while ensuring quality education. This approach not only makes learning more accessible but also promotes the vibrancy of regional languages, a key aspect highlighted in the UGC guidelines for promoting IKS. Moreover,

the inclusion of Santali and Sanskrit as mediums of instruction for specific courses like B.A. in Santali and B.A. in Sanskrit further underscores the college's commitment to linguistic inclusivity. While the study of Bengali and Santali literatures adds impetus to the study of regional, tribal and indigenous culture, the study of Sanskrit literature provides vigor to the Vedic ways of learning and disseminating cultural heritage. Most of the PG courses except Bengali are mostly taught in English at Belda College. Vernacular language is followed too as medium of interaction in classrooms. This approach gives confidence to rural, semi-rural and first-generation learners of our college. Cultural celebrations and events play a pivotal role in fostering a sense of belongingness and pride among students. Belda College's observance of various cultural festivals and occasions such as Saraswati Puja, Netaji Jayanti, Welcome Ceremony, Republic Day, Independence Day, National Youth Day, and International Mother Language Day not only adds colour to campus life but also serves as a platform for promoting Indian arts and traditions. Santali Bhasa Vijoy Dibos is celebrated every year by the Department of Santali. The patronisation of Indian classical music and the establishment of Yoga and Meditation Centre further contribute to the holistic integration of IKS into the college ecosystem. The UGC guidelines provide a comprehensive framework for the incorporation of IKS into higher education curricula. By mandating the inclusion of IKS courses amounting to atleast 5% of the total mandated credits, with the flexibility for students to explore a larger fraction, the guidelines ensure a balanced approach to knowledge dissemination. Moreover, the emphasis on training and orienting faculty members towards IKS through induction programs and refresher courses is crucial for fostering a conducive learning environment. The integration of Indian knowledge systems into college education, as exemplified by Belda College, represents a paradigm shift towards a more inclusive and holistic approach to learning. By embracing linguistic diversity, celebrating cultural traditions, and incorporating IKS into its curricula as prescribed by the Affiliating University, the college not only enriches the educational experience but also contributes to the preservation and promotion of India's invaluable heritage.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

At Belda College, education goes beyond simply imparting knowledge; it is designed to equip students for the demands of the professional world. With a strong emphasis on outcome-based education (OBE), the college strives to foster individuals who

excel academically while also gaining practical skills and competencies. To support this vision, Belda College offers a range of initiatives, including the introduction of add-on, certificate, and value-added courses, all aimed at bridging skill gaps and better preparing students for their future careers. These courses offer interdisciplinary learning opportunities and hands-on experiences. A fundamental aspect of OBE is the clear definition of Course Outcomes (CO), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Programme Outcomes (PO). Students are made acquainted with these outcomes, and their achievement is assessed qualitatively, particularly for those nearing the end of their programs. By aligning curriculum objectives with these outcomes, the college ensures that students are equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills for their chosen fields. Throughout the programme, students are evaluated through Internal Assessments at regular intervals and End Semester Examinations, tutorials, assignments, project work, presentations etc. Empowering students is a core principle at Belda College. Regular counselling, guidance, and mentoring sessions provide support to the students in exploring their potential and planning their professional development. Additionally, various certificate courses further enhance students' employability by focusing on industry-specific skills. The college encourages active learning and critical thinking through activities like debates, discussions, and quizzes. With a focus on employability, Belda College integrates career counselling sessions into its curriculum. Additionally, a variety of curricular and extra-curricular activities contribute to enhancing program outcomes and enriching the overall learning experience. The college also emphasizes experiential learning through activities such as swyam-siddha, yoga, and meditation. These activities promote individual growth and cognitive development. In line with the National Education Policy (NEP), Belda College promotes outcome-based education. Outcome-based education approach reflects dedication of Belda College to preparing students for success in the modern world. Through a combination of academic excellence, practical skills, and holistic development, the college equips students with the tools they need to thrive in their careers.

20.Distance education/online education:

At Belda College, the shift to online education has become crucial since the COVID-19 pandemic. Faculty members delivered courses mostly offline but during vacation or engaged in other activity faculties prefer to take online classes. e-content was made available on our website, supporting continuous education

throughout the nationwide closure of Higher Educational Institutions. At Belda College, we have seamlessly integrated blended learning into our educational model, combining traditional classroom teaching with innovative online methods. While in-person instruction remains at the core, we've expanded our offerings to include numerous add-on and certificate courses delivered online, catering to diverse learning needs. Departments also conduct webinars, special classes, and assessments online, enhancing the overall learning experience. The use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) tools like Google Workspace, YouTube, PPT presentations, virtual classrooms, and INFLIBNET has significantly boosted the effectiveness of our online education initiatives. Hybrid learning, blending technology with face-to-face interactions, fosters greater student engagement and participation. In line with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Belda College has implemented best practices in distance education and online learning. As a study centre for Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU), we offer a wide range of undergraduate, postgraduate, certificate, and diploma courses through distance learning. Nearly 980 students have appeared for various examinations through our centre. All admission and examination processes, both for distance education and regular UG/PG courses, are conducted online. Recognizing the importance of teacher training, we prioritize professional development opportunities for faculty, and encourage both students and faculty to engage with platforms like SWAYAM, DIKSHA, and YouTube to create and consume content. To further enrich the learning experience, the installation of Lecture Capturing Systems allows for the creation of high-quality e-content. Beyond academics, we also organize doubt-clearing sessions, online seminars, and motivational talks, fostering holistic development and a strong sense of community. These initiatives reflect our commitment to developing well-rounded individuals equipped for success in a digital world.

Belda College, a government-aided institution affiliated with Vidyasagar University, strictly follows the curriculum and academic calendar set by the university. The college focuses on efficient curriculum delivery, strategic planning, and providing flexibility to students through various initiatives.

At the start of each academic session, the academic calendar is prepared under the supervision of the IQAC and Academic Subcommittee, ensuring alignment with the university's schedule. This calendar is then made available on the college website and notice board. The Routine Committee prepares and distributes the timetable for UG and PG programs.

The Principal, IQAC Coordinator, and Academic Subcommittee meet to plan curriculum implementation, covering internal assessments, evaluation methods, teaching-learning strategies, and the inclusion of relevant add-on or value-added courses.

Departmental heads, in consultation with faculty, create departmental routines in coordination with the master routine.

The teaching-learning process includes traditional lectures supported by ICT tools like projectors and laptops, along with well-equipped laboratories. The learning experience is enriched through seminars, webinars, special lectures, projects, quizzes, presentations, group discussions, fieldwork, and industrial visits.

Continuous evaluation is conducted through the internal assessments, projects, and competitions, with records maintained digitally. The college strictly follows the academic calendar, organizing internal assessments for both UG and PG programs. Class tests help identify students' learning progress, leading to specialized support through remedial and tutorial sessions.

The college also organizes student seminars, quizzes, poster presentations, and publishes e-magazines and wall magazines, ensuring a well-rounded learning experience.

The internal examination procedures at Belda College adhere to principles of transparency, flexibility, and robustness. Aligned with VU regulations and the academic calendar, the institution meticulously follows a structured internal evaluation process. This information is systematically communicated to students during the induction program at the commencement of each academic year and to parents through Parent- Teacher meetings. Student performance is comprehensively evaluated through a blend of continuous academic assessments (assignments, quizzes, group discussions, creative writing, debates, seminars, poster presentation etc.) and co-curricular activities (cultural competitions, sports/games, etc.) throughout the year. These assessments aim to cultivate expressiveness, articulate communication, and critical thinking skills among students. Additionally, continuous assessments, including written, mock, or online multiple-choice questions, are administered upon the completion of each topic or course to gauge overall performance. For students requiring additional support, ongoing assessments are conducted through class monitoring, revision classes, and remedial sessions throughout the academic year. Detailed discussions on individual student performance take place within the classroom, with specific attention given to identifying challenges and outlining opportunities for improvement. Indirect Method: In the indirect method, an exit survey is conducted for all students at the end of the semester using structured questionnaires. The ratings and relationships of POs and PSOs with the questionnaire are presented in quantitative form. The collected data are then analysed and the

attainment level is measured. The final attainment is determined once the target level is reached using both methods. Additional Parameter: An important parameter for measuring attainment is the progression of students towards higher education and their placement in government or corporate jobs through qualifying exams such as NET, SET, GATE, and SSC.

Belda College campus consist of almost 11 acres of land with buildings, greeneries and pond. The campus facilitates excellent infrastructure for teaching-learning process, career progression and higher education. There are JC Bose building, Kedarnath Das Building, Vidyasagar Building, Ambedkar building and Netaji Subhas Building. The Ambedkar building accommodates the chamber of the Principal (01), Administrative office (03), IQAC Room (01), Nodal Office (01), Examination section (01), Theatre Hall (01), Classrooms (4), and Gymnasium etc. Other buildings of the college accommodate Classrooms (36), Girls 'waiting room (01), Students' Council room (01), Washrooms, NSS Room (01), NCC Room (01), Placement Cell (01), Career Counselling Cell, &

Psychological Counselling & Health Check-up Room (01), Laboratories (18), Staff rooms(21), Reading room (01), Central library (01), Canteen (01). In addition a meditation room also there. Belda College Central library was established in 1963 concurrent with the establishment of the College. Initially, the library's collection consisted of a modest amount of 44 books in its stock. Since its inception, the library has providing its services to the users (like students, faculties and non teaching staff) of this college. At present this library contains about 31,173 printed books as on 30th June 2024. Library also provide access to 6150 e journals and 1,99, 536 + ebooks through the membership in N-List INFLIBNET. In 2014 the Library completed its retro conversion project for printed documents which was completed in 2015 all the library started its journey in automated environment by using bar-coding technology. At that time this automation was done in the SOUL 1.0 Software. After that in 2018 a new server machine procured and installed in the library. Simultaneously library also upgraded its automation software from Soul 1.0 to Soul 2.0 and all data migration is done under the guidance of INFLIBNET Centre. After that library again achieved another remarkable achievement in 2022 i.e. installation of KOHA ILMS in Cloud Server. So that users can remotely search the library catalogue at any time and form anywhere.

Since its establishment in February 2007, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Belda College has made a substantial contribution to the institutionalization of quality assurance procedures and methods. Belda College, a government-aided institution affiliated with Vidyasagar University, strictly follows the curriculum and academic calendar set by the university. The college focuses on efficient curriculum delivery, strategic planning, and providing flexibility to students through various initiatives.

At the start of each academic session, the academic calendar is prepared under the supervision of the IQAC and Academic Subcommittee, ensuring alignment with the university's schedule. This calendar is then made available on the college website and notice board. The Routine Committee prepares and distributes the timetable for UG and PG programs.

The Principal, IQAC Coordinator, and Academic Subcommittee meet to plan curriculum implementation, covering internal assessments, evaluation methods, teaching-learning strategies, and the inclusion of relevant add-on or value-added courses. Departmental heads, in consultation with faculty, create departmental routines in coordination with the master routine.

The teaching-learning process includes traditional lectures supported by ICT tools like projectors and laptops, along with well-equipped laboratories. The learning experience is enriched through seminars, webinars, special lectures, projects, quizzes, presentations, group discussions, fieldwork, and industrial visits.

Continuous evaluation is conducted through the internal assessments, projects, and competitions, with records maintained digitally. The college strictly follows the academic calendar, organizing internal assessments for both UG and PG programs. Class tests help identify students' learning progress, leading to specialized support through remedial and tutorial sessions.

The college also organizes student seminars, quizzes, poster

presentations, and publishes e-magazines and wall magazines, ensuring a well-rounded learning experience.

The internal examination procedures at Belda College adhere to principles of transparency, flexibility, and robustness. Aligned with VU regulations and the academic calendar, the institution meticulously follows a structured internal evaluation process. This information is systematically communicated to students during the induction program at the commencement of each academic year and to parents through Parent- Teacher meetings. Student performance is comprehensively evaluated through a blend of continuous academic assessments (assignments, quizzes, group discussions, creative writing, debates, seminars, poster presentation etc.) and co-curricular activities (cultural competitions, sports/games, etc.) throughout the year. These assessments aim to cultivate expressiveness, articulate communication, and critical thinking skills among students. Additionally, continuous assessments, including written,

mock, or online multiple-choice questions, are administered upon the completion of each topic or course to gauge overall performance. For students requiring additional support, ongoing assessments are conducted through class monitoring, revision classes, and remedial sessions throughout the academic year. Indirect Method: In the indirect method, an exit survey is conducted for all students at the end of the semester using structured questionnaires. The ratings and relationships of POs and PSOs with the questionnaire are presented in quantitative form. The collected data are then analysed and the

attainment level is measured. The final attainment is determined once the target level is reached using both methods. **Additional Parameter:** An important parameter for measuring attainment is the progression of students towards higher education and their placement in government or corporate jobs through qualifying exams such as NET, SET, GATE, and SSC.

Belda College campus consist of almost 11 acres of land with buildings, greeneries and pond. The campus facilitates excellent infrastructure for teaching-learning process, career progression and higher education. There are JC Bose building, Kedarnath Das Building, Vidyasagar Building, Ambedkar building and Netaji Subhas Building. The Ambedkar building accommodates the chamber of the Principal (01), Administrative office (03), IQAC Room (01), Nodal Office (01), Examination section (01), Theatre Hall (01), Classrooms (4), and Gymnasium etc. Other buildings of the college

accommodate Classrooms (36), Girls 'waiting room (01), Students' Council room (01), Washrooms, NSS Room (01), NCC Room (01), Placement Cell (01), Career Counselling Cell, & Psychological Counselling & Health Check-up Room (01), Laboratories (18), Staff rooms(21), Reading room (01), Central library (01), Canteen (01). In addition a meditation room also there. The campus houses Boys' Hostel (01). All the departments are equipped with adequate number of ICT-enabled class rooms, laboratories and sufficient space for hosting all academic activities. Belda College Central library was established in 1963 concurrent with the establishment of the College. Initially, the library's collection consisted of a modest amount of 44 books in its stock. Since its inception, the library has providing its services to the users (like students, faculties and non teaching staff) of this college. At present this library contains about 31,173 printed books as on 30th June 2024. Library also provide access to 6150 e journals and 1,99, 536 + ebooks through the membership in N-List INFLIBNET. In 2014 the Library completed its retro conversion project for printed documents which was completed in 2015 all the library started its journey in automated environment by using bar-coding technology. At that time this automation was done in the SOUL 1.0 Software. After that in 2018 a new server machine procured and installed in the library. Simultaneously library also upgraded its automation software from Soul 1.0 to Soul 2.0 and all data migration is done under the guidance of INFLIBNET Centre. After that library again achieved another remarkable achievement in 2022 i.e. installation of KOHA ILMS in Cloud Server. So that users can remotely search the library catalogue at any time and form anywhere.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

Belda College has a well-defined, systematic organisational structure and governance. The Governing Body is responsible for ensuring effective management on campus. The Principal with assistance from the IQAC and Heads of the departments regularly monitors academic and other activities of the college. Among the Statutory Bodies, Governing Body authorises planning and administration. All the proposals, plans and budgets presented by the PG BOS and statutory bodies like Academic Subcommittee, Finance Committee etc. and other non-statutory bodies are placed before the Governing Body for approval. Academic Subcommittee takes decisive position in academic matters. Finance Committee analyses and approves the budgets submitted by the departments. Non-statutory bodies take care of the overall planning and

execution of a few academic, non-academic, co- curricular, and extracurricular activities. Some of the key non-statutory bodies include the Examination Committee, Tender Subcommittee, Purchase Subcommittee, Building Subcommittee, IQAC, Grievance Redressal Cell, Admission Committee, Cultural Subcommittee, etc. Standard Operating Procedures (SOP's) are created for various academic and administrative processes. The recruitment procedure, promotional policies and service rules are as per the rules of the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal and the guidelines of UGC for appointments in State-aided colleges in West Bengal.

Since its establishment in February 2007, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Belda College has made a substantial contribution to the institutionalization of quality assurance procedures and methods.
