




5.4 Details of student support mechanism for coaching for competitive examinations (If any)

Introduction

For the academic year 2013-14, IQAC, Belda College sought feedback from parents, alumni and students. Analysis of Feedback



Students' Feedback on Institution, Facilities and Teaching-Learning




 How, according to you, are the facilities in this college for overall development of the students? Response:




2. Is, according to you, the class routine of the college convenient for the students? Response:




3. How, according to you, is the role played by the college in bringing in a sense of disciplining to the students? Response:




 Is according to you, the number of classes taken in this college sufficient so far as the different courses are concerned? Response:




 How do you weigh the contribution of the teachers of your college in enriching your knowledge? Response:




 How do you rate the contribution of the teachers of this college to the betterment of the students in the extra-curricular field? Response:




 Do you think that the teachers of this college offer help to students on academic matters, even outside the classroom? Response:

While 78 percent students expressed their satisfaction on the number of classes taken for the coverage of syllabus in class, 22 percent of them reported that that they needed more meaningful assistance from teachers beyond the class room. Close to 80 percent of the students reported that they were satisfied with the availability of books in college library as well as with the behavior / cooperation of library staff. 40 percent of the students demanded concession in tuition fees whereas 50 percent of them felt the need for more full-time teachers. Female students comprised 45 percent of the total students and 70 percent of them demanded formation of an NSS Unit exclusively for girls. Students of some departments also complained about long time intervals between classes. Analyzing the feedback and recommendations provided by the students, it is noticed that the students have made the following major demands:

- Annual educational tour to be organized at Shimla, Kulu, Manali etc. next year.
- Recruitment of Fulltime faculty in Philosophy, Commerce, Zoology, Mathematics Chemistry etc.
- Appointment of Permanent Librarian.
- Installation of a Basket Ball court.
- Increase of books in library.
- Demand for more books in library in Bengali, English, Botany, Chemistry, Philosophy, History, Music etc.
- Use of ICT & more Smart Class.
- Smooth conduct of Students' Union Election












5. Do you think that the teachers help in developing your ward's rational outlook? Response:




6. Do you think that the college has helped in moulding your ward's personality?


7. Do you think that the extracurricular activities provided to your ward by the college are adequate?




8. What are your impressions about the teachers of your ward as guide to his/her learning?



- Concession in Tuition Fees.


- Reaccreditation by NAAC




1. What is your present occupation? Response:




2. Are you satisfied with your profession? Response:




3. If you are continuing your education at present what is the reason for it? Response:






7. Do you still want to stay attached to your alma mater? Response:







ACTION TAKEN

The feedbacks received from alumni, students and their parents constitute an essential input in the decision-making process of the college going forward. A final report is therefore prepared by IQAC detailing the various responses/recommendations received along with a note containing the main findings. This report was shared with the Principal and the various administrative bodies functioning in the college, in particular, the College Governing Body, the apex administrative body of the Institute - for their cognizance and taking/initiating appropriate actions. The future planning of the IQAC and the management for the betterment of the college is inspired by the Report of Feedback analysis.

Administrative Actions Taken/Initiated

The Principal and the Governing Body of the College agreed to take initiatives to

- Introduce new UG Honours courses.
- Recruit new teachers.
- Purchase Books for Library.
- Go for assessment and accreditation by NAAC.
- Set up English Language Lab.
- Identify Job-oriented/Vocational Courses that are in demand.
- Create new Smart Classrooms.
- Establish a Basket Ball Court.

Initiatives to Improve Teaching-Learning Outcomes

The Principal and IQAC met the teachers to apprise them of the feedbacks received on teaching-learning and individual performance. The Principal of the college discussed the results of the student evaluation of each teacher by meeting the teacher and discussing his/her weaknesses and strengths confidentially. The aim was not to victimize the teacher but to improve individual performance and strengthen Teaching/Learning prevalent in the college. Teachers were encouraged to

- Ensure syllabus is completed in time.
- Be more careful in mentoring the wards.
- Keep the time interval between classes to a maximum of two hours.
- Schedule meeting hours with the students to assist them beyond the classroom.
- Update themselves with the recent developments in their respective subjects.

BEST PRACTICE 1

Title of the Practice: Introduction of ICT in Teaching-Learning Process

Objective of the Practice:

- > To enhance the quality of Teaching-Learning prevalent in the college
- > To facilitate the teaching-learning process
- > To enhance the teaching capabilities of the teachers as facilitators of learning
- > To enrich the learning experience of the students
- > To cope up with the changing demands of higher education in twenty first century
- > To foster global competencies among our students
- > To make teaching-learning more student-centric
- > To make learning more enjoyable and independent
- > To enhance the research aptitudes of the faculty and students
- > To enhance and sustain the quality of education provided by the college
- > To offer students and faculty members access to more intellectual resources
- > To take the teaching and learning process out of the classroom

Need Addressed and the Context:

The application of ICT in teaching-learning has been envisaged as one of the exigent strategies for enhancement of the quality of teaching and learning process in our institution. The adoption of traditional "Chalk and Talk" method in classroom teaching creates one kind of monotony and has not attained desirable success in arresting the attention of the learners in the classes. Students also feel the want of quality lectures delivered by experienced faculty outside their classroom at their convenient times. The Library also cannot provide all the materials needed for advancement of studies and research. For keeping pace with the rapid change in the field of higher education brought about by the increasing use of ICT, teachers and students should also develop intimacy with the devices used and strategies deployed. This facilitates the teaching-learning process and supports them during workshops, seminars, conferences and research activities.

The Practice:

For promoting ICT-enabled Teaching-Learning process, our college has deployed a number of strategies which are reflected in the following practices:

- Each department has been provided with the facilities of using Laptop and LCD/Overhead Projector. Seventeen Laptops and projectors have been purchased for this purpose. The college allocates funds for procurement, upgradation, deployment and maintenance of the ICT devices, computers and their accessories.
- The college has created four Smart Class rooms where the teachers can take class with the help of Smart Board, Visualizer, Overhead Projector and Laptop.
- The College has deployed A-VIEW (Amrita Virtual Interactive eLearning World) which is an award-winning indigenously built multimodal, multimedia e-learning platform that provides an immersive e-learning experience. A-VIEW is a part of Talk to a Teacher program coordinated by IIT Bombay and funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) under the Indian Government's National Mission for Education using Information

and Communication Technology (NME-ICT) along with various other projects in Virtual Labs, Haptics and Natural Language Processing.

- The College Library has subscribed to INFLIBNET N-List to provide teachers and students access to a large number of e-books and e-journals.
- Faculty members are provided with computers with internet facility for preparation of teaching/learning materials in their respective departments.
- > The institution has plans to equip all classrooms with interactive boards.
- The college has requested the teachers to adopt the use of ICT aids in at least 30% of total teaching.
- Internet service has been made available in the college for faculty and students. There are several computers with broadband connectivity.
- The College has provided broadband connection to certain departments. In certain blocks of the college, Wi-Fi facility is available.
- > The college has prepared a full-fledged computer laboratory.
- Students are also encouraged to prepare slides and power points as a part of their assignments. Thus the teaching-learning process involves both the teachers and students.
- Professionals from corporate sectors are invited to impart training to the teachers regarding the new technology to be applied.

Evidence of Success:

- Use of ICT in Teaching-Learning process has created huge enthusiasm among the students and teachers. Teaching-learning process has now become more exciting for the faculty and the students. There has been a remarkable increase in the attendance of the students in classes in which ICT is used.
- ICT is being used in Belda College in an extensive way to make the teaching learning process more enjoyable. ICT is being used for seminars, classroom teaching and presenting the lesson through Power Point. Teachers have been teaching with the help of slides, transparency sheets and Power Points.
- Students and teachers have developed acquaintance with the ICT devices and new technologies.
- LCD Projectors and Overhead Projectors are being used in regular teaching and learning process.
- Through INFLIBNET students and Teachers are now accessing a great number of e-journals and e-books in the library.
- > The college also has Seminar Hall equipped with projector and smart board. Seminars and special lectures are enriched with the application of ICT.
- Computer lab provides the students technology-enabled learning spaces. Computer teachers help the students in this regard.
- Students prepare lessons and presentations through ICT and the teachers play the role of facilitators.
- Through the multi-modal, multimedia e-learning platform provided by A View, the students can have independent e-learning experience. Our teachers help them to use the facility.
- > The students browse on Google, You Tube etc. for novel ideas and study materials.
- Students abundantly use ICT during Students' seminar.

Problems Encountered:

The major problem encountered initially was the reluctance of the senior teachers to accept the transformation in the traditional teaching-learning process. Lack of technical expertise of the teachers to apply the new technology was another obstacle in the way of the introduction of the system. However, through constant motivation and training, such obstacles have been overcome.

BEST PRACTICE 2

Title of the Practice: Security Enhancement through Installation of CCTV Cameras

Objective of the Practice:

Campus security has become one of the thrust concerns in all the Higher Educational Institutions. With this view in mind, Belda College Governing Body has stressed on the strengthening of the security of the students and employees of the college. Emphasis has also been given on the protection of the valuable assets and infrastructure of the college.

Need Addressed and the Context:

The need for security enhancement in the campus sprang up because of few untoward incidents caused by the outsiders inside the campus and increasing intrusions of the outsiders befooling the Gate Keeper inside the campus endangering the security of the students and staff. Harm caused to the valuable plants inside the campus also caused the necessity of tightening of security. Belda College, being a reputed co-educational institution of West Midnapur district, the need for a secured campus was felt by the administrative authorities, teachers, students, as well as parents and the local residents. Necessity of security enhancement was also felt for the protection of the library books, laboratory equipments and other valuable assets and infrastructure of the college.

The Practice:

Keeping in view the interests of all stakeholders of the college, security measures were enhanced and tightened in Belda College campus. No student is allowed to enter the college premises without the production of college Identity card at college gate. Additionally, a good number of CCTV cameras were installed in the nooks and corners of the college campus (including College Gate, Library, Laboratory, corridors, classrooms, office, canteen etc.).

Evidence of Success:

The security enhancement initiative through installation of CCTV has witnessed huge success. In some cases of damage of property inside the campus and untoward incidents, steps are taken following CCTV footage. No incident of theft was reported in last few months. Entry of the miscreants coming from outside and untoward incidents inside the campus has been reduced to a great extent. Employees and female students feel now more secure inside the campus. Students and staff remain cautious before being involved in any misconduct or broil.

Problems Encountered:

Initially, a section of students and employees were against the installation of CCTV cameras as they viewed it as interference in privacy. A few suggestions as well as grievances emerged in the Grievance Redressal Cell regarding the installation of cameras even in sitting areas as it created an obstacle for some insincere students indulging in bunking the classes. However, through constant motivations and discussions, such obstacles were overcome.

Resources Required:

Financial support for purchase of CCTV and installation was required. The college made arrangements for the financial and infrastructural resources required.
