Belda College has already initiated undertakings to transmute itself into a holistic and multidisciplinary institution of learning as envisioned by the propositions of NEP 2020. The Institution aspires to contribute towards the overall development of the students and deems the adoption of multidisciplinary approach as a vital component in this regard. The focus is hence extended to imparting knowledge in "scientific," "vocational," and "professional" fields, as well as "soft skills" alongside the specific subject area. The Institution, within the scope of opportunity provided by the Affiliating University, strives to adopt an inclusive frame of learning in order to develop a comprehensive frame of mind in the learners by cultivating intellectual, physical, social, moral, aesthetic and emotional The Institution presently follows curricula that capacities. enable productive conversations across the disciplines. The prescribed syllabi require students of all undergraduate programmes to study Environmental Science. Again, all undergraduate students studying in Honours and General courses including those studying Technology (BCA) are required to undertake Modern Indian Languages (Compulsory Bengali and Compulsory English alternatingly) as an integral part of the curricula. The fusion of Humanities and Social Sciences with Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) in undergraduate levels gives a wider exposure to the students and help them broaden their understanding. Our college has infused a credit-based system for the courses it offers and also entails project work in the areas of environmental education. The college organizes and encourages the students to partake in value-based education and activities in the areas of community engagement and service at regular intervals. The current curricula prescribed by the Affiliating University does not leave much scope for flexible innovations, nor includes exclusive credit-based courses and projects in connection with community engagements. The present system offered by the Affiliating University does not provide the flexibility in the curriculum to execute multiple entries and exits at the end of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd years of undergraduate education. The same is expected to be implemented in near future. The Institution aspires to broaden the scope of learning through effective research across disciplines. Alongside the compulsory research work in Environmental Studies, students are encouraged to adopt multidisciplinary approach to discover positive and practical solutions to emergent ecological issues. The Institution's endeavours to promote multidisciplinary research can be cited through the establishment of Research Centre in Natural Sciences that encourages researchers, and faculties to

engage in multidisciplinary research work to encounter the pressing issues and challenges in the present society. The establishment of departments in Languages (Santali, Sanskrit), Literature (Bengali, English), Music, Philosophy, Theatre & Stagecraft, Education, Mathematics, Commerce, Pure Sciences, Sociology, Nutrition, Economics, Physical Education, Professional Course like BCA, Vocational Courses like Software Development, Medical Laboratory Technology and other such subjects induces an environment of multidisciplinary learning system stimulating Indian education and environment. Our Institution thus, within the available scope, cultivates and promotes several good practices like endorsing community engagements and initiating multidisciplinary conversations that might be enhanced with the measures envisioned for implementation in view of NEP 2020 in near future.

### 16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

NEP 2020 aims to provide a flexible experience at learning through multiple entries and exits offered that would enable the student to opt in or out of the courses according to their choices. Academic Bank of Credit, as a vital component in executing this flexible model, is introduced to function as a digital repository of the academic credits earned by the students in various courses that they have taken in different HEIs throughout their academic journey. ABC would serve as an authentic central record for checking and citing the credit point of any student at any given point in time. Since our college follows the model prescribed by the Affiliating University, it is not within the discretion of the college to implement the system of Academic Bank of Credits. Hence, there is no provision of ABC within the structure followed at present. The existing system enables the students to carry forward their academic credits from one semester to the next in terms of intra-university domain. The flexible model of multiple entries and exits are not made available to the students of the Institution either. However, the college anticipates the adoption of NEP 2020 norms with a flexible accreditation, to be implemented by the Affiliating University. Faculties of the Institution are being sensitized in this regard. They are also encouraged to introduce innovative pedagogical approaches in the teaching-learning process. As per NEP guidelines, full library access to journals, a fully functional computer lab, and laboratory infrastructure for research work are the college's top priorities. Faculties are encouraged to make use of digital platforms such as SWAYAM, MOOC, NSQF for smooth transition to future programmes, as advised in

NEP 2020. The college understands that these platforms will be of immense value once the NEP is implemented, particularly for Skill Enhancement Courses. Keeping this in view, our college is organizing regular programmes to sensitise the teaching community as well as the anticipated student community of the locality to link Aadhar cards with their Mobile Number since it will be required during registration in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC).

### **17.Skill development:**

Belda College is committed to fostering a holistic educational experience for its learners. Through a multifaceted approach, the institution aims to instil positive values and equip students with essential life skills. Our initiatives include: Observance of Significant Days: We commemorate important occasions with fervour to raise awareness and promote values. Programs and Seminars: We organize events that facilitate knowledge exchange, critical thinking and personal growth. Integration of Education and Skill Development through Add-On and Certificate Courses: By aligning education with practical skills, we equip students with the competencies they need to succeed. To provide the students with an opportunity to enhance their learning journey, various Departments have introduced through specialized courses as Add-on or Certificate Courses like- Certificate Course in Sanskrit Grammar, Certificate Course on Creative Writing, Certificate Course on Medicinal Food: Science of Food, Nutrition & Selfhealing, Add-On course on The Constitution of India: Structural Design and Functional Aspects, Certificate Course on Office Management, Certificate Course on First Aid, Add-on Course on Rabindrik Taal in Association with Vocal Training, Add-on Course in Bio-floc Fish Farming, Certificate Course on Application of Artificial Intelligence (CCAAI) on the Study of Nutrition and Research. VU Prescribed Curriculum: B. VOC courses in Medical and Laboratory Technology, Health Care have been introduced in the academic session 2021-22 which is continuing with increase in student's enrolment. The affiliating University's prescribed curriculum provides provision for skill enhancement through the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC's) which aim to improve the skill levels of students in domains like cognitive, analytical, employable, communication, social, etc. Industrial visits & Field Visits: As per the prescribed curriculum, various departments of the college organise field visits & Industrial Institution's Innovative Council (IIC): visits for the students. The college has established the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) which intends to motivate students through webinars,

guidance & trainings to develop their competencies, preparing them for the job market.

**18.**Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The integration of Indian knowledge systems (IKS) into college education, particularly through the medium of Indian languages and culture, represents a significant step towards reclaiming and revitalizing indigenous wisdom. Belda College, with its commitment to bilingual education and celebration of diverse cultural traditions, stands as a prime example of this progressive approach. By incorporating elements of IKS into its teaching-learning methodology, the college not only promotes regional languages but also fosters a deeper understanding and appreciation of India's rich heritage. The bilingual mode of instruction at Belda College, where courses are taught in both Bengali and English, reflects a conscious effort to cater to students' linguistic diversity while ensuring quality education. This approach not only makes learning more accessible but also promotes the vibrancy of regional languages, a key aspect highlighted in the UGC guidelines for promoting IKS. Moreover, the inclusion of Santali and Sanskrit as mediums of instruction for specific courses like B.A. in Santali and B.A. in Sanskrit further underscores the college's commitment to linguistic inclusivity. While the study of Bengali and Santali literatures adds impetus to the study of regional, tribal and indigenous culture, the study of Sanskrit literature provides vigour to the Vedic ways of learning and disseminating cultural heritage. Most of the PG courses except Bengali are mostly taught in English at Belda College. Vernacular language is followed too as medium of interaction in classrooms. This approach of Belda College gives confidence to rural, semi-rural and first generation learners of the college. Cultural celebrations and events play a pivotal role in fostering a sense of belonging and pride among students. Belda College's observance of various cultural festivals and occasions such as Saraswati Puja, Netaji Jayanti, Welcome Ceremony, Republic Day, Independence Day, National Youth Day, and International Mother Language Day not only adds colour to campus life but also serves as a platform for promoting Indian arts and Santali Bhasa Vijoy Dibos is celebrated every year traditions. by the Department of Santali. The patronisation of Indian classical music and the establishment of a Yoga and Meditation Centre further contribute to the holistic integration of IKS into the college ecosystem. The UGC guidelines provide a comprehensive framework for the incorporation of IKS into higher education

curricula. By mandating the inclusion of IKS courses amounting to at least 5% of the total mandated credits, with the flexibility for students to explore a larger fraction, the guidelines ensure a balanced approach to knowledge dissemination. Moreover, the emphasis on training and orienting faculty members towards IKS through induction programs and refresher courses is crucial for fostering a conducive learning environment. The integration of Indian knowledge systems into college education, as exemplified by Belda College, represents a paradigm shift towards a more inclusive and holistic approach to learning. By embracing linguistic diversity, celebrating cultural traditions, and incorporating IKS into its curricula as prescribed by the Affiliating University, the college not only enriches the educational experience but also contributes to the preservation and promotion of India's invaluable heritage.

### 19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

At Belda College, learning is more than just acquiring knowledge; it is about preparing students for the challenges of the professional world. Through a dedicated focus on outcome-based education (OBE), the college aims to develop individuals who possess not only academic excellence but also practical skills and competencies. To achieve this goal, Belda College has implemented various initiatives. These include the introduction of add-on/certificate/value-added courses to fill skill gaps and enhance students' readiness for the workforce. These courses offer interdisciplinary learning opportunities and hands-on experiences. A fundamental aspect of OBE is the clear definition of Course Outcomes (CO), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Programme Outcomes (PO). Students are made acquainted with these outcomes, and their achievement is assessed qualitatively, particularly for those nearing the end of their programs. By aligning curriculum objectives with these outcomes, the college ensures that students are equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills for their chosen fields. Throughout the programme, students are evaluated through Internal Assessments at regular intervals and End Semester Examinations, tutorials, assignments, project work, presentations etc. The outcome is also assessed through the collection of Employer's Certificate from employed alumni. Empowering students is a core principle at Belda College. Regular counselling, guidance, and mentoring sessions provide support to the students in exploring their potential and planning their professional development. Additionally, various certificate courses further enhance students' employability by focusing on industry-specific skills. The college encourages active learning

and critical thinking through activities like debates, discussions, and quizzes. These engagements stimulate intellectual curiosity and improve students' problem-solving abilities. Participation in add-on/certificate courses provides practical exposure in areas like Bee-keeping, Biofloc, Mushroom Culture, Soft Skills etc. Exit form surveys conducted at the end of each program offer valuable insights into students' overall learning experiences. This feedback helps the college continually refine its teaching methods and curriculum to meet students' needs and industry demands. With a focus on employability, Belda College integrates career counselling sessions into its curriculum. Additionally, a variety of curricular and extracurricular activities contribute to enhancing program outcomes and enriching the overall learning experience. The college also emphasizes experiential learning through activities such as swayam-siddha, yoga, and meditation. These activities promote individual growth and cognitive development. In line with the National Education Policy (NEP), Belda College promotes outcomebased education. By offering certificate courses in emerging fields like Biofloc and Beekeeping, the college adapts to the changing needs of industries and creates opportunities for selfemployment. Outcome-based education approach reflects dedication of Belda College to preparing students for success in the modern world. Through a combination of academic excellence, practical skills, and holistic development, the college equips students with the tools they need to thrive in their careers.

### **20.Distance education/online education:**

At Belda College, the shift towards electronic and online medium in education has become essential, particularly in response to the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. Utilizing our existing digital infrastructure, we have successfully embraced online education, ensuring uninterrupted academic activities and creating an environment conducive to learning. During the nationwide closure of Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) due to the pandemic, Belda College swiftly adapted to online education. Our faculty members adeptly delivered course content through various online platforms such as social media, emails, Zoom, Microsoft Teams, and Google Meet. Additionally, a wealth of e-content was meticulously curated and made available to students through our college website, enabling continuous learning. Embracing innovation and flexibility, blended learning has become integral to our educational approach. While traditional classroom teaching remains fundamental, we have expanded our offerings to include numerous add-on/certificate courses in online mode,

catering to diverse learning preferences. Departments continue to organize webinars, special classes, and evaluations online, enriching the overall learning experience. The integration of various Information and Communication Technology (ICT) tools, including Google Workspace, YouTube, PPT presentations, virtual classes, and INFLIBNET, has significantly enhanced the effectiveness of our online learning initiatives. Hybrid learning, which combines technology with face-to-face instruction, has emerged as a dynamic pedagogical approach, fostering student engagement and interaction. Aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Belda College has implemented several best practices in distance education and online learning. Notably, we serve as a study centre for distance education courses offered by Netaji Subhas Open University thereby expanding access to higher education. The study centre of Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) has offered students scope of pursuing five U.G, eleven P.G., two certificate and two diploma courses through distance mode of learning. Almost 980 students appeared for different examinations in this center. Admission and examination related all activities are performed in online mode both in distance education and regular UG and PG courses of Belda College. Recognizing the importance of teacher training in facilitating effective online education, Belda College prioritizes professional development opportunities for faculty members. Moreover, we encourage students and faculty to utilize platforms such as SWAYAM, DIKSHA, and YouTube for content creation and consumption, fostering a culture of self-directed learning. The installation of Lecture Capturing Systems facilitates the creation of high-quality e-content, enhancing the learning experience for our students. In addition to academic endeavours, Belda College organizes doubt-clearing classes, online seminars, and motivational talks, promoting holistic development and fostering a sense of community among students and faculty members. These initiatives underscore our commitment to nurturing well-rounded individuals equipped with the skills and competencies needed to thrive in a digital age.

Belda College, a Government-aided institution affiliated with Vidyasagar University, strictly adheres to the curriculum and Academic Calendar prescribed by the affiliating university. The college emphasises effective curriculum delivery, strategic planning, and flexibility for students through various initiatives.		
At the beginning of each academic session, the Academic calendar is prepared under the supervision of the IQAC & Academic Subcommittee, aligning with the given university's schedule, and is made available on the college website and notice board. The routine committee formulates and distributes the Time Table (UG & PG), displayed both on the college website and on notice boards.		

The Principal, coordinator, IQAC, and Academic Subcommittee meet to strategize curriculum implementation, including scheduling Internal Assessments, evaluation methods, teaching-learning approaches, and the incorporation of relevant Add-on/Value-added courses. Departmental Heads, in consultation with faculty, create departmental routines, ensuring coordination with the master routine.

The Teaching-Learning process employs traditional lectures and ICT tools like projectors and laptops, coupled with wellequipped laboratories. Seminars, webinars, special lectures, projects, quizzes, presentations, group discussions, fieldwork, and industrial visits complement the overall process.

Continuous evaluation, including mock tests, internal assessments, projects, and competitions, is documented and stored electronically. # 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Belda College campus consist of almost 11 acres of land with budlings, greeneries, pond etc. The campus facilitates excellent infrastructure for teaching-learning process, career progression and higher education. There are JC Bose building, Kedarnath Das Building, Vidyasagar Building, Ambedkar building and Netaji Subhas Building. The Ambedkar building accommodates the chamber of the Principal (01), Administrative office (03), IQAC Room (01), Nodal Office (01) Examination section (01), Theatre Hall (01), Classrooms (4), and Gymnasium (01)etc. Other buildings of the college accommodate Classrooms (36), Girls'waiting room (01), Students' Council room (01), Washrooms, NSS Room (01), NCC Room (01), Placement Cell (01), Career Counselling Cell, & Psychological Counseling & Health Checkup Room (01), Laboratories (18), Staff rooms(21), Reading room (01), Central library (01), Canteen (01). In addition a meditation room also there. The campus also houses Boys' Hostel (01). All the departments are equipped with adequate number of ICT-enabled class rooms, laboratories and sufficient space for hosting all academic activities. The College has one Seminar Hall and one theatre room with capacity of 210 & 150 respectively for organizing special lecturers and meetings. Among the class rooms

some of them equipped with smart-boards instead of screens.

A dedicated room for research Centre for Inter-Disciplinary Studies for all the Science Departments is located in Kedarnath Das Building. The college offers facilities like Lecture Capturing System, Ramp, lift and differently abled userfriendly toilet, Screen reading software etc.

Belda College Central library was established in 1963 along with the foundation of this college. This library opened firstly with only 44 books in its stock. This library is providing its services to the users (like students, faculties and non teaching staff) of this college since 1963. At present this library contains about 31,173 printed books as on 30th June 2023 & subscribed 27 printed periodicals (Both Journals and magazines) as on 31st December 2022. Library also provide access to 6000+ e journals and 1,00,000 + ebooks through the membership in N-List INFLIBNET. In 2014 the retro conversion work for the printed documents completed and from the year 2015 all the library started its journey in automated environment by using bar-coding technology. At that time this automation was done in the SOUL 1.0 Software. After that in 2018 a new server machine procured and installed in the library. Simultaneously library also upgraded its automation software from Soul 1.0 to Soul 2.0 and all data migration is done under the guidance of INFLIBNET Centre. After that library again achieved another remarkable achievement in 2022 i.e. installation of KOHA ILMS in Cloud Server. So that users can remotely search the library catalogue at any time and form anywhere.

A dedicated team of electrician, plumber, sweepers, carpenters and gardeners provide round the clock service to Departments, Hostels, Classrooms, Canteen, Laboratories and Library. Computers and peripherals are checked, cleaned, calibrated and maintained by the technical assistants hired from outside time to time. Fire Extinguishers are frequently checked. APB & Co., a Chartered Accountant firm, meticulously verifies all financial transactions, including bills, payments, receipts, journals, vouchers, cash books, and ledger accounts from the previous academic year. Based on the audit, a detailed report is prepared and submitted to the college management.

For external audits, an auditor appointed by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal reviews the financial records at the end of each fiscal year. The audited statements of income and expenditure, as well as the balance sheets, are certified. The auditor verifies whether the revenue, expenditure, assets, and liabilities are accurately reflected in the income and expenditure account and balance sheet or not, adhering to the regulatory requirements. The audit report is then submitted to the Department of Higher Education. Any minor errors, omissions, or discrepancies identified by the audit team are instantly rectified, and preventive measures are implemented to prevent future recurrence.

Based on feedback collected and audit reports, various innovative activities were planned, implemented, and reforms were proposed to the management for ratification and implementation. The most crucial duty of the IQAC is to prepare the AQAR. The entire team ensures that the report is efficiently created and delivered on time. It is posted online by the institution after receiving NAAC approval.

The IQAC makes significant recommendation for the improvement of the faculties and students. Students are encouraged to participate in different seminars and present posters. The faculties are expected to present papers at seminars, conferences, workshops, faculty development programmes, etc. The institution grants leave of absence for the same reasons. The faculties are also encouraged to submit research papers in university-approved publications as well as compose books, book chapters, and books.
