
INTRODUCTION

The Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) was conducted online through the Google form with the assistance of respective academic departments. The questionnaire in this regard was prepared in accordance with the NAAC guidelines through which the students assessed & marked the overall performance of the Institution. Students were asked to assess the overall online Teaching-Learning experience, quality of curriculum, Mentoring system, Teacher's performance in class. A total of 382 students have participated in this survey. The summary of the survey has been prepared by the IQAC & is presented in the IQAC meeting, which is displayed on the college website under the IQAC section.

RESULT OF THE SURVEY

A detailed analysis of the Students Satisfaction Survey for the academic year 2022-23 obtained (online through Google form) from 382 students is graphically presented below:


CHART 1



The above chart illustrates the nature of programmes (UG/PG) students are pursuing. The majority of the students (respondents), i.e.,90.8% belong to the Undergraduate programme (UG) while the rest 9.2% belong to the PG programme.





The above chart illustrates the gender-wise distribution of the students (respondents) who have taken part in this SSS. 54.7% of the respondents are female, while 45.3% are male.



The chart illustrates students' responses regarding the coverage of the syllabus. 55% responded that 85%-100% syllabus was covered by the teachers (online & offline), while 31.4% students responded that 70%-84% of the syllabus was covered during the Academic Session 2022-23.



From the above graph, it can be seen that 49.2% of the students shared that Teachers were thoroughly prepared for the class, 43.7% have shared that Teachers' preparation for the classes was satisfactory.






































